

1. GARD report on radio transmissions and estimated operations numbers for August 2014

Summary:

- Estimate of 3,190 operations for month of August (Based on 4 transmission per arrival and 3 per departure)
- 3,711 minutes of transmission averaging 8 seconds in length
- Total estimated operations (takeoffs and landings) at SFM year to date September 2nd is 16,073


Estimate of Aircraft Operations Per Day For the 08 Month 2014

2. Southern Maine SRT and Lifeflight Train at SFM



On 8/12/2014 representatives of LifeFlight conducted a training session with the Southern Maine Special Response Team (SRT). This training included a classroom portion consisting of an overview of LifeFlight services and capabilities as well as protocols and requirements for requesting LifeFlight aircraft. At the completion of the classroom portion the training moved to SFM where a LifeFlight helicopter was flown in. After a tour of the aircraft and an instruction period, practical exercises were conducted simulating the request and arrival of LifeFlight services. The

exercises simulated an injured Special Response Team officer transported in a tactical vehicle to the landing zone of the LifeFlight aircraft. Coordination between LifeFlight personnel and the SRT officers was emphasized as they unloaded the patient from the tactical vehicle and prepared to move to the aircraft. Multiple iterations of the exercise were conducted until proficiency was obtained. The training will make interactions between the two teams safer and the familiarity can save lives.



The Southern Maine Special Response Team is a group of officers from a number of York County law enforcement agencies who work together to resolve high risk events such as armed and barricaded suspects, hostage situations and high risk warrant service. The team trains a minimum of twice a month accumulating at least 192 hours of applicable training per year. This team meets the requirements of and is certified by the Maine Criminal Justice Academy as a tactical team. There are currently 19 law enforcement officers and three paramedics assigned to the team.
