What you can do during the Civil State of
Emergency declared by the Governor




Vehicle Registrations

- Vehicle Registrations (including temporary registrations) that expire during the state of emergency are EXTENDED to 30 DAYS following the end of the state of emergency declared by the Governor.

- This includes, without limitation:
 - Motor vehicles
 - Trailers
 - Watercraft
 - Snowmobiles
 - All-terrain vehicles

- This means current or expired Maine registrations, temporary dealer registrations from Maine or New Hampshire licensed dealers ARE VALID THROUGH THE STATE OF EMERGENCY AND 30 DAYS BEYOND ITS TERMINATION.

- Rapid Renewal for vehicle registrations:
 - Print your confirmation and keep as a record of your registration.
 - As the State BMV is able, they will mail registrations out to customers.
- New vehicles cannot be done online first time.
 - Your temp plate from the dealer is valid during the state of emergency until 30 days after its termination.

- Absentee Ballot Request for the June 9, 2020 State Primary & School Budget Validation Election is OPEN and when the ballots are available will be mailed out (around May 9th).
- Property Tax payments can still be done on-line with the additional fees as before. If you want to mail a check for your March 16th installment, interest is waived through April 17th.
